AN ACT AUTHORIZING TRIAL COURT JUSTICES TO ENGAGE IN COLLECTIVE BARGAINING.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary,  
2 and notwithstanding any management function they may  
3 have, all justices of the Trial Court shall have all rights for  
4 collective bargaining and organization and may be repre-  
5 sented by an employee organization certified by the labor  
6 relations commission or recognized by a public employer as  
7 an exclusive representative under the provisions of section  
8 four of chapter one hundred and fifty E of the General Laws.
