**AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RETIREMENT RIGHTS OF EMPLOYEES  
OF SEWER DEPARTMENTS.**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 *Group 4.* Division of law enforcement, office of the secre-  
2 tary of the executive office of environmental affairs; officials  
3 and employees of the registry of motor vehicles appointed by  
4 the registrar under section twenty-nine of chapter ninety;  
5 capitol police; members of the state police detectives appoint-  
6 ed under section six of chapter twenty-two, serving in any  
7 division of the department of public safety; members of the  
8 police force of the metropolitan district commission; employ-  
9 ees of the Massachusetts Port Authority at the General Ed-  
10 ward Lawrence Logan International Airport, comprising per-  
11 manent crash crewmen, fire control men, assistant fire con-  
12 trol men; members of police and fire departments not classi-  
13 fied in Group 1; any police officer of the Massachusetts Bay  
14 Transportation Authority; employees whose regular compen-  
15 sation is paid by the United States from funds allocated to the  
16 Massachusetts National Guard and who are regularly and per-  
17 manently employed under the control of the military depart-  
18 ment of the commonwealth and whose duties in such em-  
19 ployment require substantially all normal working hours and  
20 whose continued employment is based upon federal recogni-  
21 tion in the Massachusetts National Guard; employees of a  
22 municipal gas or electric generating or distribution plant who  
23 are employed as linemen, electric switchboard operators, elec-

24 tric maintenance men, steam engineers, boiler operators, fire-  
25 men, oilers, mechanical maintenance men, and supervisors of  
26 said employees; employees of the department of correction  
27 who are employed at any correctional institution or prison  
28 camp under the control of said department and who hold the  
29 position of correction officer, female correction officer, indus-  
30 trial instructor, recreation officer, assistant industrial shop  
31 manager, industrial shop manager, assistant to the supervisor  
32 of industries, supervisor of industries, senior correction offi-  
33 cer, senior female correction officer, prison camp officer, senior  
34 prison camp officer, supervising prison camp officer, assistant  
35 deputy superintendent, chief of security for the University  
36 of Massachusetts medical school or supervising indentification  
37 agent; employees who hold the position of state hospital stew-  
38 ard in the department of correction; the sheriff, superintend-  
39 ent, assistant superintendent, assistant deputy superintendent  
40 and correction officers of county correctional facilities; and  
41 the chief fire warden and district fire wardens in the execu-  
42 tive office of environmenatal affairs; and all field maintenance  
43 and supervisors of the Boston Water and Sewer Commission.
