**AN ACT RELATIVE TO ACCUMULATED VACATION TIME FOR
JUDICIAL SERVICE.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary
2 or other administrative rule or regulation, a judge shall be
3 permitted to carry over a total of ninety days of accumulated,
4 unused vacation time, according to the following schedule:
5 upon completion of fifteen years of such service, one hundred
6 and twenty days; upon completion of twenty years of service,
7 one hundred and fifty days; upon completion of twenty-five
8 years of service, one hundred and eighty days. For purposes
9 of this act, vacation time shall not be considered accumulated
10 for any calendar year until the first day of January of the
11 succeeding year —
