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**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-three.

AN ACT ESTABLISHING THE BLUE HILL-DUDLEY REGIONAL  
COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AGENCY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. There shall be established within the depart-  
2 ment of Community Development, but not subject to it, a  
3 separate and independent corporation known as the Blue Hill-  
4 Dudley Regional Community Development Agency. Said agen-  
5 cy shall have a chairman appointed by the governor with  
6 experience in rehabilitation redevelopment and financial or  
7 banking expertise and two members of the community, all  
8 of whom are appointed by the governor to serve at his pleas-  
9 ure for a term coterminous with the governor.

1 SECTION 2. The area comprising wards nine, twelve and  
2 fourteen and those areas encompassing the Franklin Park,  
3 Franklin Field, and the area immediately adjacent to Codman  
4 Square in the Roxbury and Dorchester sections of Boston shall  
5 comprise the area for construction, reconstruction, landscap-  
6 ing, redevelopment, rehabilitation and repair and planning.

1 SECTION 3. The said Blue Hill-Dudley Regional Community  
2 Development Agency shall be empowered to spend fifty mil-  
3 lion dollars; said monies shall be raised by a bond issue called  
4 the "Blue Hill-Dudley Regional Community Development  
5 Agency Bond Issue". The monies, so-called, shall be expended  
6 for construction, reconstruction, landscaping, planning, re-  
7 developing, rehabilitating and repairing said property bounded  
8 and described pursuant to section two of this act.

1 SECTION 4. The agency shall be subject to all the laws rela-

2 tive to public bidding for contracts required by the common-  
3 wealth.

1 SECTION 5. The state auditor and the inspector general shall  
2 review at least annually, all financial records and contracts  
3 and other pertinent data of said agency.
