AN ACT RELATIVE TO CERTAIN ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANTS IN THE SUPERIOR COURT DEPARTMENT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 83 of Chapter 276 of the General Laws, as most re-
2 cently amended by chapter 779 of the acts of 1981, is hereby
3 amended by striking out the second paragraph and inserting
4 in place thereof the following paragraph: —

5 In the superior court department, for such counties as have
6 twenty or more probation officers, there shall be designated
7 by the chief probation officer, from among said probation of-
8 ficers, an administrative assistant to said chief probation of-
9 ficer. Said administrative assistant shall, in addition to his
10 regular duties, perform such other duties as said chief proba-
11 tion officer may determine and shall receive a salary at the
12 same job group level as a first assistant chief probation officer.
