AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE DISPENSING OF CONTROLLED  
SUBSTANCES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 149 is hereby amended by striking out section 19B,  
2 as most recently amended by chapter 620 of the acts of 1973,  
3 and inserting in place thereof the following section: —

4 *Section 19B.* Any employer who subjects any person em-  
5 ployed by him, or any person applying for employment, in-  
6 cluding any person applying for employment as a police of-  
7 ficer, to a lie detector test, or requests, directly or indirectly,  
8 any such employee or applicant to take a lie detector test, shall  
9 be punished by a fine of not more than two hundred dollars;  
10 provided, however, that any employer licensed to manufacture,  
11 distribute or dispense narcotics or controlled substances sched-  
12 uled or referred to in chapter ninety-four C may require an  
13 employee to submit to a lie detector test as a condition of em-  
14 ployment or continued employment. The person administering  
15 such lie detector test shall be selected from a list of qualified  
16 individuals approved by the attorney general.
