By Mr. Brennan, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 2108) of John A. Brennan, Jr., for legislation to provide that the five percent credit granted to a veteran applying for an electrician's license be granted regardless of the time of application for such license. Government Regulations.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT THE FIVE PERCENT CREDIT GRANTED TO A VETERAN APPLYING FOR AN ELECTRICIAN'S LICENSE BE GRANTED REGARDLESS OF THE TIME OF APPLICATION FOR SUCH LICENSE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 141 of the general laws is hereby amended by strik-
- 2 ing section 2A and inserting in place thereof a new section: —
- 3 2A Examinations; Credit to Veterans
- 4 In the conduct of examinations they shall make uniform re-
- 5 quirements for all towns, which may be revised from time to
- 6 time, as circumstances require. They shall grant a credit of
- 7 five percent to the examination standing of each applicant
- 8 who is a veteran, as defined in clause forty-three of section
- 9 seven of chapter four. Said examinations shall be sufficiently
- 10 frequent to give ample opportunity for all applicants to be
- 11 thoroughly and carefully examined, may be written or in prac-
- 12 tical work, and may be supervised by one or more of the ex-
- 13 aminers, but no license shall be granted without the sanction
- 14 of the examiners.
