By Mr. Kirby, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 116) of Edward P. Kirby for legislation to provide for more equitable disqualification from unemployment benefits. Commerce and Labor.

AN ACT TO PROVIDE A MORE EQUITABLE DISQUALIFICATION UNDER
THE EMPLOYMENT SECURITY LAW.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section twenty-four of chapter one hundred and fifty-one A
2 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the
3 first paragraph of subsection (c), as appearing in section nine-
4 teen of chapter four hundred and seventy-three of the acts of
5 nineteen hundred and seventy-six, and inserting in place
6 thereof the following paragraph: —

7 (c) The duration of his unemployment and until he has
8 had four more weeks of work in each of which he earned an
9 amount equal to or in excess of his weekly rate, if he fails
10 without good cause to accept an offer of suitable employment
11 when made by an employing unit or has refused or failed to
12 investigate a referral to work when directed to do so by a
13 local employment office of the division.
