AN ACT RELATIVE TO CERTAIN CREDITABLE SERVICE FOR EUGENE J. HURLEY, A SERGEANT OF THE CAPITOL POLICE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 309 of the Acts of 1983 is hereby amend-
2 ed by striking out all after the words "including" in line 3, and
3 inserting in place thereof the following: —

4 July thirtieth, nineteen hundred and eighty-six, provided
5 that he is mentally and physically capable of performing the
6 duties of his office or position. Said Eugene J. Hurley shall an-
7 nually, at his own expense, be examined by an impartial physi-
8 cian designated by the State Retirement Board to determine
9 such capability. No further deductions shall be made from the
10 regular compensation of said employee under the provisions
11 of Chapter thirty-two of the General Laws for service subse-
12 quent to July thirtieth, nineteen hundred and eighty-four, and
13 upon retirement said employee shall receive a superannua-
14 tion retirement allowance equal to that to which he would have
15 been entitled had he retired on said date.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
