AN ACT RELATIVE TO PROJECT C.O.A.C.H., INC.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary,
2 any political subdivision of the Commonwealth is hereby au-
3 thorized to appropriate and transfer funds to Project Com-
4 munity Organization for Alternative Court Help, Inc., other-
5 wise known as Project C.O.A.C.H., Inc., a nonprofit corpora-
6 tion located in the Commonwealth and engaged in the opera-
7 tion of alternative sentencing programs; provided that such
8 appropriations or transfers are for the purpose of furthering
9 the goals, aims and purposes thereof. Any state or govern-
10 ment agency in the Commonwealth is hereby authorized, sub-
11 ject to appropriation, to make contracts or to provide grants
12 to Project C.O.A.C.H., Inc., for such purposes. All such ap-
13 propriations, contracts and grants shall be subject to the pro-
14 visions of law regulating the disbursement of public funds.
