By Mr. Webber, a petition of Peter C. Webber and Christopher J. Hodgkins (by vote of the town) for legislation relative to compensation paid to the board of assessors in the town of Richmond. Local Affairs.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

AN ACT RELATIVE TO COMPENSATION PAID TO THE BOARD OF
ASSESSORS IN THE TOWN OF RICHMOND.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of section one
2 hundred and eight of chapter forty-one of the General Laws
3 or any other general or special law to the contrary, the action
4 of the Town of Richmond, taken on June eighteenth, nineteen
5 hundred and eighty-four at a special town meeting, and ap-
6 propriating the total sum of four thousand nine hundred thirty
7 dollars (\$4,930) to be paid in certain specified sums to named,
8 present and former members of the Board of Assessors for
9 said town for services performed during fiscal years nineteen
10 hundred and eighty-two, nineteen hundred and eighty-three
11 and nineteen hundred and eighty-four, is hereby ratified,
12 validated and confirmed, and the town is hereby authorized
13 to expend said monies as specified in said Town Meeting vote.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

The Constitution of the State

Article I. The Legislative Department

Section 1. The legislative power shall be vested in a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The Senate shall be composed of members chosen for terms of four years.

Section 3. The House of Representatives shall be composed of members chosen for terms of two years.

Section 4. The members of the Senate and House of Representatives shall be elected by the people.

Section 5. The Senate shall have the sole power to impeach and try judges.

Section 6. The House of Representatives shall have the sole power to impeach and try officers.

Section 7. The Senate shall have the sole power to confirm and disapprove appointments.

Section 8. The House of Representatives shall have the sole power to originate bills for raising revenue.

Section 9. The Senate shall have the sole power to ratify and reject treaties.

Section 10. The House of Representatives shall have the sole power to impeach and try officers.
