AN ACT EXTENDING ELIGIBILITY TO PROVIDE 14 DAY ALCOHOL REHABILITATION TREATMENT PROGRAMS FOR SECOND OFFENDER DRUNK DRIVERS TO PRIVATE VENDORS.
