AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE DISCHARGE OF CERTAIN PERSONS COMMITTED TO DRUG TREATMENT FACILITIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 111E of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding
2 the following section: —

3 Section 19. No person who has been committed to a treatment
4 facility as a drug dependent person including, but not limited to,
5 a person committed to the Massachusetts correctional institution
6 at Bridgewater, if a male, or at Framingham, if a female, shall
7 be released to the community wherein such facility is located. Such
8 person shall be returned to the jurisdiction where in resided
9 immediately prior to his commitment.
