AN ACT RELATIVE TO REGISTRATION OF ANTIQUE AUTOMOBILES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 90 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting
2 after section 5B the following section: —

3 Section 5C. Every owner of an antique motor vehicle, instead
4 of registering each vehicle owned by him, may make application
5 for a general distinguishing number or mark, and the registrar,
6 if satisfied of the facts stated in the application, may issue to the
7 applicant a certificate of registration containing the name and
8 address and the general distinguishing number or mark assigned
9 to him and made in such form and containing such further
10 information as the registrar may determine. All antique vehicles
11 owned by such person shall be regarded as registered under the
12 general distinguishing number or mark assigned to him. Such
13 plate assigned to such person shall only be used on antique
14 automobiles owned by him. The registrar shall charge a fee of fifty
15 dollars for such registration and such registration shall be valid
16 for a period of three years.
