1     *Ordered*, That the Committee on Public Safety be authorized  
2 to sit during the recess of the General Court to make an  
3 investigation and study of Senate document 1003 and House  
4 document 1859, both relative to establishing fire safety standards  
5 for cigarettes. Said committee shall report to the General Court  
6 the results of its investigation and study, and its recommendations  
7 into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk of the Senate on or  
8 before the last Wednesday in December, nineteen hundred and  
9 eighty-eight.
