AN ACT RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING PHYSICIAN FEES FOR WORKER'S COMPENSATION.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Section 13 of Chapter 152 of the General Laws is hereby
- 2 amended by adding to sentence one of the second paragraph the
- 3 following: — unless the insurer and physician otherwise agree
- 4 in writing.

By Mr. Keating, a private bill was introduced for the relief of William R. Keating for his services in connection with the construction of the Erie and Ontario Canal.

**32d. Conductors of Railroads**

*In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Nine*

AN ACT RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING PENALTIES FOR THE CONDUCTORS OF RAILROADS.

Enacted by the Senate and Assembly of the State of New York in session assembled, and by the Governor of the State, on the 1st day of August, 1889.

Section 11 of Chapter 137 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding to section one of the second paragraph the following:— "When the railway and the conductor thereof are in violation of the provisions of this section, the conductor shall be liable to a fine of not more than five hundred dollars."
