AN ACT PROVIDING FOR HABILITATIVE SERVICES FOR THOSE GRADUATING FROM HIGH SCHOOL OR THOSE TURNING TWENTY-TWO.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 12C of Chapter 71B of the General Laws is hereby
- 2 amended by striking the first sentence and substituting in place
- 3 thereof the words: A disabled person who has been receiving
- 4 special education under the provisions of this chapter shall be
- 5 eligible upon graduation from high school or upon attaining the
- 6 age of twenty-two, whichever occurs first, to receive habilitative
- 7 services in the manner hereinafter provided.
