AN ACT PROHIBITING DISCIPLINARY ACTION AGAINST ANY EMPLOYEE, INCLUDING POLICE OFFICERS, BASED ON THE RESULTS OF A LIE DETECTOR TEST.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 149 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by adding thereto the following new sentence:

3 However, the results of lie detector tests administered by law
4 enforcement agencies shall not be grounds for disciplinary action
5 by any employer against any employee, including police officers.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect on passage.
