AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE JET FUEL TAX COLLECTED AT LAWRENCE G. HANSCOM FIELD.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 12 of Chapter 64J of the General Laws,  
2 as appearing in the 1986 Official Edition, is hereby amended by  
3 inserting at the end thereof the following sentence: —

4 “Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this section and  
5 the provisions of section 27C of Chapter 29 of the General Laws,  
6 the sums distributed, credited, and paid to each of the towns of  
7 Bedford, Concord, Lexington, and Lincoln in which the  
8 provisions of this chapter are in effect shall be equal to the total  
9 of such sums received from the sale or use of aircraft fuel at the  
10 Lawrence G. Hanscom Field divided by the number of said  
11 aforementioned towns in which the provisions of this chapter are  
12 in effect.

1 SECTION 2. Upon a vote of town meeting in each of the  
2 aforementioned towns in which the provisions of section one are  
3 in effect, said towns may designate all or a portion of the sums  
4 received from the sale of aircraft fuel for the purposes of funding  
5 certain planning activities of the four-town regional group known  
6 as Hanscom Area Towns II.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage.
