The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Nine.

1 *Ordered*, That the Rules of the Senate be amended by adding
2 the following new Rule: —

3 Rule 1A. During each session of the Senate a recitation of the
4 “Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag,” shall immediately follow the
5 prayer offered by the Chaplain.

Approved by the Senate on the 10th day of March, 1903.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE STATE

As amended by the Legislature at its regular session in 1902.

Article I. The Legislature shall be composed of a Senate and a House of Representatives. The Senate shall be elected by the people of the State at large, and the House of Representatives shall be elected by the people of the several counties. The Senate shall have the sole and exclusive power of impeachment, and the House of Representatives shall have the sole and exclusive power of trial of impeachments. The Senate shall have the sole and exclusive power of confirming and rejecting appointments made by the Governor, and the House of Representatives shall have the sole and exclusive power of impeaching and removing the Governor.
