AN ACT EXEMPTING CERTAIN POSITIONS IN THE TOWN OF DARTMOUTH
FROM CIVIL SERVICE LAW.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General
Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The positions of laborers in the department of
2 public works and cafeteria workers, custodial and maintenance
3 persons in the department of education in the town of Dartmouth
4 shall be exempt from the provisions of chapter thirty-one of the
5 General Laws.

1 SECTION 2. The provisions of section one shall not impair the
2 civil service status of any person holding the position of laborer
3 in the department of public works or cafeteria worker or custodial
4 or maintenance person in the town of Dartmouth on the effective
5 date of this act.
