AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING POLICE TRAINING.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The first paragraph of Section ten of Chapter
2 fifteen A of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the
3 following: —

4 Notwithstanding the provisions of section five, the board of
5 trustees of the Massachusetts Maritime Academy are hereby
6 authorized and directed to establish a program of study leading
7 to a bachelor of science degree in criminal justice and are hereby
8 further authorized to grant said degree; provided however that
9 said trustees shall provide for the enrollment of at least two
10 hundred students in said program; and provided further that the
11 enrollees of said program shall be subject to the same rules and
12 regulations concerning discipline and living accommodations as
13 the academy's maritime students. Persons who receive said degree
14 shall be deemed to have attended an approved regional or
15 municipal police training school for the purposes of section
16 ninety-six B of Chapter forty-one or any other similar provision
17 of law.

1 SECTION 2. This act will take effect as of August 1, 1989.

SECTION 1. The Commission on the Administration of the State Government shall consist of the following members:
