## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO COMPENSATION OF RETIREMENT BOARD MEMBERS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 32 of the General Laws, as appearing in  
2 the 1988 Official Statement, is amended in section 20 (4) (d<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>) by  
3 striking in line 265 the words "three thousand" and inserting in  
4 place thereof the words four thousand five hundred.

1 SECTION 2. Section 20 (4) as it appears in the 1988 Official  
2 Edition is further amended by inserting after line 289 the following  
3 paragraph:

4 (i) In any city or town which accepts the provisions of this  
5 paragraph each elected and appointed member of the retirement  
6 board shall be compensated for attending retirement board  
7 meetings at the rate of \$150 per meeting, providing that the total  
8 sum paid to any member shall not exceed two thousand four  
9 hundred dollars per annum.
