AN ACT RELATING TO THE TRANSFER OF OUT OF WEDLOCK BIRTH RECORDS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 12 of Chapter 46, as amended by Section
2 9 of Chapter 684 of the Acts of 1981, is hereby amended by delet-
3 ing the second sentence and inserting in place thereof the
4 following: — No birth record of a child born out of wedlock or
5 of a child of abnormal sex shall be so transmitted to any other
6 city or town except with the written authorization of the mother
7 at the time of the birth.

1 SECTION 2. The birth records of children born out of
2 wedlock prior to the effective date of this act may be transmitted
3 to the mother's community of residence at the time of present upon
4 presentation of acceptable documentary evidence of her residence
5 at that time to the clerk and completion of an affidavit as specified
6 under Section 13 of Chapter 46.

Bill C-100
An Act to amend the Copyright Act

Enacted by the Queen's Printer at Ottawa, Ontario, Canada, 1964.

1. The Copyright Act is amended by adding the following section:

2. (1) Where a work is first published in a country other than Canada, the author of the work shall, if he is a Canadian citizen, be deemed to have first published the work in Canada at the time of its first publication in that other country.

(2) Where a work is first published in a country other than Canada, the author of the work shall, if he is not a Canadian citizen, be deemed to have first published the work in Canada at the time of its first publication in that other country if the work is first published in that other country within a period of one year after the date of its first publication in that other country.

3. The Copyright Act is amended by adding the following section:

3. (1) Where a work is first published in a country other than Canada, the author of the work shall, if he is a Canadian citizen, be deemed to have first published the work in Canada at the time of its first publication in that other country.

(2) Where a work is first published in a country other than Canada, the author of the work shall, if he is not a Canadian citizen, be deemed to have first published the work in Canada at the time of its first publication in that other country if the work is first published in that other country within a period of one year after the date of its first publication in that other country.
