AN ACT EXEMPTING SENIOR CITIZENS FROM CERTAIN FEES AND CHARGES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 41 of chapter 92 of the General Laws,
2 as appearing in the 1988 Official Edition, is hereby amended by
3 inserting in line 6 after the word "ninety" the words: — or any
4 person sixty-five years of age or older.

1 SECTION 2. Chapter 132A of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by inserting after section 10 the following section: —
3 Section 10A. No person sixty-five years of age or older shall
4 be required to pay any fee or charge for the use of any state park,
5 beach, reservation or recreation area or for the parking of a vehicle
6 in connection with such use.
