AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A SPECIAL STUDY COMMISSION TO DEVELOP METHODS TO REDUCE THE SCHOOL DROP OUT RATE IN URBAN AREAS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 An Act to establish a special study commission to develop
- 2 methods to reduce the school drop out rate in urban areas. The
- 3 commission would study incentives to help children stay in school
- 4 and to motivate drop outs to return to school.

of the House of Representatives, passed by the House and Senate, and approved by the President, for the purpose of providing for the development of methods to reduce the consumption of alcohol in the United States.

The Commission on Alcohol

was created by the President on August 1, 1935.

It is authorized to conduct a study of the alcohol problem in the United States and to report thereon to the President.

It is further authorized to hold public hearings and to receive suggestions from interested persons.

It is authorized to employ such personnel as it may deem necessary, and to make such expenditures as may be required for the purpose of carrying out its duties.
