AN ACT RELATIVE TO INCOME TAXATION OF RETIRED MEMBERS OF THE ARMED FORCES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 5 of Chapter 62 of the General Laws, is hereby further
- 2 amended by adding after paragraph (b), the following: —
- 3 (c) notwithstanding any other provision of this Chapter the
- 4 retirement pay for a retired member of the armed forces of the
- 5 United States, who has attained the age of sixty prior to the
- 6 beginning of the taxable year, shall be exempt from taxation.

1. The Commission on the State of Education was organized in 1963 to study the state of education in California and to make recommendations for improvement.
2. The Commission has held numerous public hearings and has received many suggestions from the public.
3. The Commission has also conducted extensive research into the various problems facing the state's education system.
4. The Commission believes that the state's education system is in a state of crisis and that immediate action is required.
5. The Commission's report contains a number of recommendations for the improvement of the state's education system.
