AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE OPERATION OF COUNTY GOVERNMENT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 21C of Chapter 59 as appearing in the 1988 Official
2 Edition is hereby amended by inserting after paragraph (g) the
3 following paragraph: —

4 (g $\frac{1}{2}$) The county commissioners and the advisory board for
5 county expenditures of any county which is subject to the
6 provisions of paragraph (F) may, by a majority vote of the two
7 boards meeting together, seek voter approval to assess taxes in
8 excess of amount allowed pursuant to said paragraph (F) by a
9 specific amounts.

10 Any question submitted to the voters shall be worded as
11 follows: —

12 “Shall the county of _____ be allowed to assess an
13 additional \$ _____ in real estate and personal property
14 taxes for the purposes (state the purpose(s) for which the monies
15 from this assessment will be used) for the fiscal year beginning
16 July first, nineteen hundred and _____?”

17 YES _____ NO _____

18 Said question shall be deemed approved if a majority of the
19 persons voting thereon shall vote “yes”.
