AN ACT INCREASING PUBLIC PARTICIPATION ON THE MARINE FISHERIES
ADVISORY COMMISSION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 5A of Chapter 21 of the General Laws, as appearing
2 in the 1986 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out
3 the first paragraph and inserting in place thereof the following
4 paragraph: —

5 There shall be in the division of Marine Fisheries a commission
6 to be known as Marine Fisheries Advisory Commission,
7 hereinafter called the Commission, which shall consist of ten
8 members, nine of which shall be qualified in the field of Marine
9 Fisheries by training and experience and one of which shall be
10 a member of the general public, all to be appointed by the
11 governor with the approval of the council. As the term of a
12 member expires, his successor shall be appointed for a term of
13 three years, except that initially three members shall be appointed
14 for terms of two years and three members shall be appointed for
15 terms of one year. The governor may also, with the like approval,
16 fill any vacancy in an unexpired term. No member of the
17 commission shall hold any other position in the department while
18 serving as such, nor for a period of two years thereafter.

AN ACT RELATING TO THE MARINE FISHERIES ADVISORY COMMISSION

Enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Vermont at its regular session, held at the city of Montpelier, on the 15th day of September, 1950.

- 11 Governor with the approval of the Council, on the term of a
- 12 member's term, his successor shall be appointed for a term of

- 15 terms of one year. The Governor may step with the approval
- 16 of the Council in an emergency term. The number of the
- 17 Commission shall hold any other position in the department while
- 18 serving as such, not for a period of two years thereafter.
