AN ACT RELATIVE TO LOCAL LICENSING BOARDS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 The last paragraph of section 24J of chapter 90 of the General
- 2 Laws as most recently amended is hereby further amended by
- 3 adding the following sentence to the end of the paragraph: — The
- 4 transmittal of such information shall not be the basis of any
- 5 disciplinary action regarding such establishment's license to serve
- 6 alcohol on the premises.

AN ACT TO REPEAL CHAPTER 1007 OF THE STATUTES OF 1937.

As amended by the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of California, in
pursuance of the act of the Legislature of the State of California,
approved March 15, 1933, relating to the State Board of Health,
and for other purposes.

1. The last paragraph of section 123 of chapter 1007 of the Statutes of 1937 is hereby amended to read as follows:
2. Every person who is appointed or elected to the State Board of Health shall, before entering upon his duties, take the following oath of office: "I, _____, do hereby swear that I will faithfully and impartially discharge the duties of my office, and that I will support the Constitution of the State of California."
3. Any person who fails to take the foregoing oath of office shall be deemed to have refused to accept the office, and shall be ineligible to be appointed or elected to the office.
4. Any person who is appointed or elected to the State Board of Health shall, before entering upon his duties, take the following oath of office: "I, _____, do hereby swear that I will faithfully and impartially discharge the duties of my office, and that I will support the Constitution of the State of California."
5. Any person who fails to take the foregoing oath of office shall be deemed to have refused to accept the office, and shall be ineligible to be appointed or elected to the office.
