AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE JURISDICTION OF THE LAND COURT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 5 of chapter 254 of the General Laws,
2 as most recently amended by section 2 of chapter 760 of the acts
3 of 1987, is hereby further amended by inserting after the word
4 “lies”, in line 5, the following words: — or in the land court if
5 no part of such land is registered; and if all or part of such land
6 is registered such action shall be brought in the land court.

1 SECTION 2. Section one of this act shall not apply to civil
2 actions commenced prior to the effective date of this act.
