AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING HEARINGS ON VIOLATIONS OF PARKING REGULATIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The registrar of motor vehicles shall establish rules and
2 regulations which shall provide that a person receiving a notice
3 of a parking violation under the provisions of section twenty A
4 or twenty A $\frac{1}{2}$ of chapter ninety of the General Laws shall be
5 entitled to have the hearing, which is provided for under the
6 provisions of said sections, held before a hearing officer at the
7 branch office of the registry of motor vehicles which is closest to
8 his place of residence if he so elects.
