**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety.

RESOLVE RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING A STATEWIDE CURRICULUM CONCERNING THE ROLE OF THE ARMED SERVICES AND THEIR CONTRIBUTIONS TO OUR NATION.

1 *Resolved*, There is hereby established a special commission,  
2 composed of the following member: three members of the house  
3 of representatives, to be appointed by the speaker of the house;  
4 three members of the senate, to be chosen by the president of the  
5 senate; the commissioner of the department of education, or his  
6 designee; the president of the Massachusetts Teachers Association,  
7 or his designee; and five veterans of the armed services, two  
8 of whom shall be combat veterans of World War II, and one of  
9 whom shall be a combat veteran of the Vietnam War, to be chosen  
10 by the Governor. The purpose of said special commission shall  
11 be to study the development of a statewide curriculum for each  
12 grade level, to inform students in the important contributions that  
13 have been made to our nation by those who have served in the  
14 armed services.

15 Said special commission shall report its findings to the House  
16 and Senate, with recommendations for legislation, no later than  
17 January thirtieth, nineteen hundred and ninety-one.
