HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, April 5, 1990.

The committee on Housing and Urban Development, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 530) of John P. Burke for legislation to subsidize elderly over sixty-five years of age to maintain ownership of their homes, the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 531) of Evelyn M. Greeley for legislation to provide for live-in personnel at public elderly housing under the control of the Department of Communities and Development, the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 548) of Peter C. Webber for legislation to subsidize elderly over sixty-five years of age to maintain ownership of their homes, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1536) of Shirley Owens-Hicks and other members of the General Court that the Massachusetts Housing Finance Agency be directed to establish programs to provide for homes for the homeless and persons of low and moderate income, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2134) of Barbara E. Gray that the Massachusetts Housing Finance Agency be authorized to establish a revolving loan fund to assist single parent heads of households, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2806) of Angelo M. Scaccia and another for legislation to subsidize elderly persons up to twenty-five per cent of annual income for the purpose of maintaining possession of their homes, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4404) of Peter A. Vellucci and Gloria L. Fox relative to further regulating certain Massachusetts Housing Finance Agency rentals, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 5595) ought to be adopted.

2 Development be authorized to sit during the recess of the General
3 Court to make an investigation and study of Senate documents
4 numbered 530, 531 and 548; and House documents numbered
5 1536, 2134, 2806 and 4404, relative to elderly housing and the
6 Massachusetts Housing Finance Agency.
- 7 Said committee shall report to the General Court the results
8 of its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any,
9 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such
10 recommendations into effect by filing the same with the Clerk of
11 the House of Representatives on or before the last Wednesday
12 in December, nineteen hundred and ninety.
