AN ACT RELATIVE TO STUDENT HEALTH INSURANCE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 15A, Section 7B of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by adding at the end thereof, the following new
3 paragraph: —

4 The Department of Medical Security shall be required to act
5 as insurer of last resort by providing health insurance to any
6 student attending an institution of higher education including but
7 not limited to non-degree granting private career schools which
8 are unable to obtain insurance at a reasonable rate through any
9 insurer authorized to write accident and health insurance under
10 chapter one hundred and seventy-five, non-profit hospital service
11 corporation authorized under chapter one hundred seventy-six A,
12 a medical service corporation authorized under chapter one-
13 hundred seventy-six B, or a health maintenance organization
14 authorized under chapter one-hundred seventy-six G.
