AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING NONCRIMINAL DISPOSITION OF CERTAIN VIOLATIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 21D of chapter 40 of the General Laws,
2 as appearing in the 1988 Official Edition, is hereby amended by
3 striking out, in lines 37 and 38, the words "the next court day"
4 and inserting in place thereof the following words: — four court
5 days.

1 SECTION 2. Section 11C of chapter 85 of the General Laws,
2 as so appearing, is hereby amended by striking out, in line 55,
3 the word "next" and inserting in place thereof the following
4 word: — fourth.

1 SECTION 3. Section 18A of chapter 90 of the General Laws,
2 as so appearing, is hereby amended by striking out, in lines 38
3 and 39, the words "the next court day" and inserting in place
4 thereof the following words: — the fourth court day after the date
5 of such notice.

1 SECTION 4. Section 20A of said chapter 90, as so appearing,
2 is hereby amended by striking out, in line 63, the word "second"
3 and inserting in place thereof the following word: — fourth.

1 SECTION 5. Section 16A of chapter 270 of the General Laws,
2 as so appearing, is hereby amended by striking out, in line 49,
3 the word "next" and inserting in place thereof the following
4 word: — fourth.
