AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE USE OF MUNICIPAL PARKING METERS FOR ADVERTISING PURPOSES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The first paragraph of section 22A of chapter 40 of the General
2 Laws, as appearing in the 1988 Official Edition, is hereby amended
3 by striking out the fifth sentence and inserting in place thereof
4 the following sentence: — A city or town is hereby authorized to
5 permit the use of parking meters or parking meter posts for
6 advertising purposes and may grant rights to any person, firm or
7 corporation to attach to said parking meter post signs, devices
8 or other forms of medium for advertising purposes.

9 Section 32 of chapter 93 of the General Laws, as so appearing,
10 is hereby amended by inserting after the word “way”, in line 6,
11 the following words: — , nor shall said sections apply to signs or
12 other devices attached to the posts supporting parking meters;
13 provided, however, that a city or town in which such parking
14 meters are located may regulate the use of such posts for
15 advertising purposes.
