1 *Ordered*, That the Joint Committee on Government Regula-
2 tions be authorized and directed to make an investigation and
3 study of the issues pertaining to legislation affecting motor
4 vehicles and vital statistics. The Committee shall study and report
5 on current senate documents numbered 372 and 401.

6 Said Committee shall be provided with quarters in the State
7 House or elsewhere, may hold public hearings, may travel within
8 the Commonwealth and may expend for clerical and other services
9 and expenses such sums as may be appropriated therefore. Said
10 Committee shall report to the General Court the results of its
11 investigation and study, and its recommendations if any, together
12 with the drafts of such legislation necessary to carry such
13 recommendations into effect with filing the same with the Clerk
14 of the Senate on or before the first Wednesday of December
15 nineteen hundred and ninety.
