AN ACT RELATIVE TO REGISTRATION OF NEW VOTERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, the
2 board of selectmen of a town may appoint qualified residents of
3 the town to serve as special assistant registrars for the sole purpose
4 of registering new voters. Anyone so appointed shall take the oath
5 of office, serve under the direction and supervision of the town
6 clerk, and serve without compensation.
