The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety-Two.

AN ACT PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF TWO MESSENGERS FOR THE
PROBATE AND FAMILY COURT OF PLYMOUTH COUNTY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 217 of the General Laws as most recently amended by
- 2 Chapter 478 of the Acts of 1978 is further amended by striking
- 3 out Section 31 and inserting in place thereof the following new
- 4 section: —
- 5 Section 31. The justices of the respective divisions of the
- 6 probate and family court department may appoint the following
- 7 number of messengers for their respective divisions:
- 8 Middlesex, three messengers
- 9 Essex, one messenger
- 10 Suffolk, one messenger
- 11 Hampden, five messengers
- 12 Norfolk, three messengers
- 13 Plymouth, two messengers
- 14 Bristol, two messengers
- 15 Said justices may remove said messengers at their pleasure, and
- 16 may fill vacancies caused by removal or otherwise. Said
- 17 messengers shall wait upon the court and perform such duties as
- 18 the judges may direct, including duty as court officers. They shall,
- 19 while in attendance on the court, wear uniforms, such as the
- 20 administrative justice shall order, to be furnished at the expense
- 21 of the commonwealth.
