AN ACT TO EXTEND THE PROVISIONS FOR NON-CRIMINAL DISPOSITION OF VIOLATIONS OF MUNICIPAL BY-LAWS, ORDINANCES, RULES AND REGULATIONS TO INCLUDE THE DISPOSITION OF VIOLATIONS OF CERTAIN STATUTES, RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section one hundred and eighty-seven of chapter  
2 one hundred and eleven, as appearing in the 1986 Official Edition  
3 of the General Laws, is hereby amended by adding at the end  
4 thereof the following paragraph: —

5 In addition to any other method which may be available to a  
6 board of health to enforce the provisions of its orders relating to  
7 public health and whether such order has been issued under the  
8 General Laws, the special laws applicable to a town, the provisions  
9 of the state sanitary code or other state regulation, town by-laws  
10 and regulations of the board of health, such board may use the  
11 non-criminal method of disposition as is provided in section  
12 twenty-one D of chapter forty.

1 SECTION 2. Section fifty-seven of chapter one hundred and  
2 forty-three, as appearing in the 1986 Official Edition of the

3 General Laws is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the  
4 following paragraph: —

5 In addition to any other method which may be available to a  
6 building official to enforce the provisions of his orders relating  
7 to public safety and whether such order has been issued under  
8 the General Laws, the special laws applicable to a town, the  
9 provisions of the state building code or other state regulation,  
10 town by-laws and regulations, such official may use the non-  
11 criminal method of disposition as is provided in section twenty-  
12 one D of chapter forty.

1 SECTION 3. Section thirty of chapter one hundred and forty-  
2 eight, as appearing in the 1986 Official Edition of the General  
3 Laws, is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the  
4 following paragraph: —

5 In addition to any other method which may be available to a  
6 fire official to enforce the provisions of his orders relating to public  
7 safety and whether such order has been issued under the General  
8 Laws, the special laws applicable to a town, the provisions of the  
9 state fire prevention code or other state regulation, town by-laws  
10 and regulations, such official may use the non-criminal method  
11 of disposition as is provided in section twenty-one D of chapter  
12 forty.
