AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE TRANSFER OF A STATE-OWNED WATER LINE IN THE COUNTY OF WORCESTER.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or  
2 special law to the contrary, the Commissioner of the Division of  
3 Capital Planning and Operations is hereby authorized to convey  
4 certain property known as the 'Grafton Water Line' to the Grafton  
5 Water District, subject to a written agreement between said  
6 Division and said Grafton Water District, for purposes of control,  
7 maintenance and upgrade of the system.

1 SECTION 2. The subject water system is supplied from the  
2 City of Worcester and is comprised of a system of water mains  
3 installed in 1924. The line is nine miles long and serves several  
4 residences in Shrewsbury, the Tufts University Veterinary School,  
5 and property owned by the State and either leased or used by state  
6 agencies. The water line is described in plans entitled "Grafton  
7 State Hospital, Location of WaterSupply Main Pipe Lines,  
8 Grafton & Shrewsbury Mass." JJ VanValkenburgh—CE  
9 Framingham, MA, scale 1"=80' dated January 1924 (8 sheets);  
10 and, "Grafton State Hospital, New Water Supply System, Plans  
11 Showing Location of Pipes, Hydrants, Gates and Connections to  
12 Buildings" JJ VanValkenburg—CE Framingham, MA, scales as  
13 noted, dated February 1924 (7 sheets).
