AN ACT REQUIRING THE DISPLAY OF CERTAIN INFORMATION RELATIVE TO THE SALE OF SKI EQUIPMENT.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 94 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the
2 following section: —

3 *Section 321.* No person shall distribute, sell or offer to sell
4 within the commonwealth any ski equipment which does not con-
5 tain thereon a conspicuous label, or in lieu thereof a sign conspicu-
6 ously displayed in the place of sale, with information as to the
7 weight range and depth of skill appropriate for such equipment.
8 Whoever violates the provisions of this section shall be punished by
9 a fine of not more than one hundred dollars.
