AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE RECIPROCAL ENFORCEMENT OF CERTAIN TRAFFIC REGULATIONS BY THE CITIES OF BOSTON AND NEWTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The Newton Police Department is hereby author-
2 ized to enforce the parking and towing rules and regulations of the
3 City of Boston with respect to that portion of Beacon Street in the
4 City of Boston which abuts the City of Newton, including specifi-
5 cally the portion of Beacon Street in Boston from the Boston-New-
6 ton boundary easterly to Malia Terrace, provided however, that
7 the City of Newton Police Department may use its own towing
8 services in lieu of those authorized by the City of Boston, and
9 further provided that the City of Newton Police Department may
10 use its own parking citations which shall be processed in Middlesex
11 County, and the fees for such towing and storage shall be those
12 authorized by the Department of Public Utilities, and the fine for
13 such parking violations shall be those authorized by the ordinances
14 of the City of Newton.

1 SECTION 2. The Boston Police Department is hereby author-
2 ized to enforce the parking rules and regulations of the City of
3 Newton with respect to that portion of Beacon Street in the City of
4 Newton which abuts the City of Boston, and any violations thereof
5 shall be processed in Suffolk County.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT OF CERTAIN PUBLIC UTILITIES IN THE CITIES OF BOSTON AND NEWTON.

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Assembly convened for that purpose, on the twenty-first day of the month of February, A. D. 1912.

SECTION 1. The Newton Public Department is hereby authorized to enter the parties and holding rates and regulations of the City of Boston with respect to the portion of Boston street fronting the City of Boston which abuts the City of Boston, including the portion of Boston Street in Boston from the Boston River to the boundary which on either side is provided however that the City of Newton Public Department may use as now having in use in that territory by the City of Boston, and further authorized that the City of Newton Public Department may use its own regulations which shall be provided in substance as follows, and the order and terms shall be those contained in the Department of Public Utilities and the order and terms shall be those contained in the Department of Public Utilities and the order and terms shall be those contained in the Department of Public Utilities.
