### AN ACT AMENDING THE TITLE OF THE DIVISION OF HEARINGS OFFICERS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 4H of Chapter 7 of the General Laws, as most recently  
2 amended by Section 66 and Section 60 of Chapter 579 Acts of 1980  
3 and Section 16(4) of Chapter 32 of the General Laws, as most  
4 recently amended by Section 12 of Chapter 514 Acts of 1978 be  
5 further amended by substituting the words, "Division of Adminis-  
6 trative Law Appeals," wherever the words, "Division of Hearings  
7 Officers" appear.

**The Constitution of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-two

Article 1. The legislative power shall be vested in the Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 1. The Senate shall be composed of not more than eight members, to be chosen by the electors of the several counties, and by the electors of the city of Boston.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of not more than thirty members, to be chosen by the electors of the several counties, and by the electors of the city of Boston. The House of Representatives shall have the sole and exclusive power of originating bills for raising revenue, and no bill for that purpose shall originate in the Senate; but the Senate may propose amendments thereto. The House of Representatives shall have the sole and exclusive power of impeaching and trying all civil officers, and all judges of the law, and all officers of the State, and all officers of the United States, and all officers of the United States who are citizens of this State, and all officers of the United States who are citizens of this State, and all officers of the United States who are citizens of this State.
