The committee on Government Regulations, to whom were referred the petition (accompanying by bill, House, No. 4109) of Rudy Chmura for legislation to regulate the extension of credit to certain persons licensed to sell alcoholic beverages; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4110) of Rudy Chmura for legislation to improve the economic stability of the alcoholic beverage industry in the Commonwealth; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4112) of Charles N. Decas (by vote of the town) that the town of Wareham be authorized to grant an additional license for the sale of alcoholic beverages not to be drunk on the premises to Glen Variety, Inc. d/b/a J.C. Package; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4281) of Daniel F. Pokaski for legislation to repeal the credit law relative to alcoholic beverages; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4282) of Daniel F. Pokaski for legislation to further regulate investigations of persons licensed to sell alcoholic beverages; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4283) of Daniel F. Pokaski for legislation to further regulate the keeping of records by package stores, so-called; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4284) of Daniel F. Pokaski that manufacturers of alcoholic beverages be required to sell such products to licensed wholesalers; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4285) of Daniel F. Pokaski for legislation to further regulate the granting of licenses for package stores, so-called; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4288) of Daniel F. Pokaski for legislation to further regulate the hours for sale of alcoholic beverages by package stores, so-called; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4289) of Daniel F. Pokaski relative to further regulating the filing of price schedules under the alcoholic beverage laws; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4802) of Michael F. Flaherty relative to the suspension of certain licenses for the sale of alcoholic beverages, and the petition (accompanied by bill,

House, No. 4996) of Royal L. Bolling, Jr., relative to the licensing of inn holders conducting certain amusements in connection with such business reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 5983) ought to be adopted.

Ordered, That the Committee on Government Regulations be authorized to sit during the recess of the General Court for the purpose of making an investigation and study of the subject matter of the current House documents numbered: — 4109, legislation further regulating the extension of credit to certain persons licensed to sell alcoholic beverages; 4110, legislation relative to improving the economic stability of the alcoholic beverages industry in the commonwealth; 4112, legislation authorizing the town of Wareham to grant an additional license for the sale of all alcoholic beverages not to be drunk on the premises to Glen Variety, Inc. d/b/a J.C. Package; 4281, legislation repealing the credit law relating to alcoholic beverages; 4282, legislation regulating investigations of persons licensed to sell alcoholic beverages; 4283, legislation regulating record keeping by package stores, so called; 4284, legislation requiring manufacturers of alcoholic beverages to sell to any wholesalers; 4285, legislation further regulating the granting of licenses for package stores, so called; 4288, legislation further regulating the hours of sales of package stores, so called; 4289, legislation further regulating the filing of price schedules under the alcoholic beverage laws; 4802, legislation relative to the suspension of certain licenses for the sale of alcoholic liquors; 4996, legislation relating to the licensing of inn holders: etc., conducting certain amusements in connection with their business.

Said committee shall be provided with quarters in the State House or elsewhere, may hold public hearings, may travel within the Commonwealth, and may expend for clerical and other services and expenses such sums as may be appropriated therefor. Said committee shall report to the General Court the results of its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of such legislation necessary to carry such recommendations into effect by filing the same with the clerk of the House on or before the first Wednesday of December, nineteen hundred and eighty-two.
