AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE ERECTION OF SIGNS TO WARN OF BLIND, DEAF
OR HANDICAPPED CHILDREN.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General
Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Section 2 of Chapter 85 of the General Laws is hereby amended
- 2 by inserting at the end thereof the following sentence: —
- 3 The provisions of this section shall not apply to the installation
- 4 by any city or town, on any way within its boundary, of signs
- 5 warning motorists of the presence of blind, deaf or otherwise
- 6 handicapped children in the vicinity.
