The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Two.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT PERSONS ON CURRENT LIST FROM WHICH CANDIDATES FOR THE UNIFORMED BRANCH OF THE STATE POLICE ARE TO BE SELECTED SHALL NOT BE SUBJECT TO MAXIMUM AGE REQUIREMENT.

1 *Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would tend to
2 defeat its purpose, which is to provide that persons on list from
3 which candidates for the uniformed branch of the state police are
4 selected shall be eligible for such selection and appointment not-
5 withstanding the maximum age requirement, therefor it is hereby
6 declared to be an emergency law, necessary for the immediate
7 preservation of the public convenience.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding the provisions of section nine A of chapter
2 twenty-two of the General Laws, any person who on the effective
3 date of this act is qualified except as to age and whose name is
4 included in an official list from which candidates for appointment
5 to the uniformed branch of the division of state police are to be
6 selected, shall be eligible for such selection and for appointment as
7 members of the uniformed branch of the state police, notwith-
8 standing the fact that such person has passed his thirtieth birthday.
