In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Eighty-Two.

Ordered, That a special committee, to consist of two members of the Senate to be designated by the president thereof and three members of the House of Representatives to be designated by the Speaker thereof, is hereby established for the purpose of making an investigation and study relating to the selection of delegates to National Conventions and alternatives to the presidential primary. Said Committee shall in the course of its investigation and study consider current House document numbered 1614, relative to establishing a caucus system for electing national delegates.

Said committee shall be provided with quarters in the State House or elsewhere, may hold hearings, may expend for legal, technical and for other services and expenses such sums as may be appropriated therefor.

Said Committee shall report to the general court the results of its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry its recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the clerk of the House of Representatives on or before the last Wednesday of June, nineteen hundred and eighty-one.
