AN ACT MAKING SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR NINETEEN HUNDRED EIGHTY-TWO FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF NORFOLK COUNTY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

SECTION 1. To provide for supplementing certain items in the current appropriation act for Norfolk County, the following sums are hereby appropriated, subject to the provisions of law regulating the disbursement of county funds and the approval thereof, for the fiscal year Nineteen Hundred and Eighty-Two.

SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary the Treasurer of Norfolk County is hereby authorized with the approval of the County Commissioners, to expend the total amount appropriated in section one from any available funds, including federal revenue funds, in the treasury of the County.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
